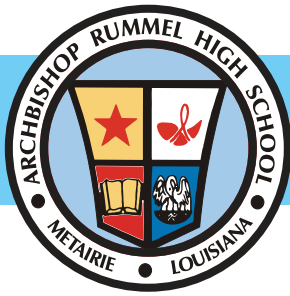

## LAPTOPS

They are fully equipped with the Microsoft Office Suite for students and come at no extra cost to the parents. The students take these laptops home with them each day and they are collected at the end of each school year for maintenance and upgrades.

## ACADEMIC

Recognizing the dignity of the individual student, Archbishop Rummel High School attempts to meet the needs of each learner by identifying his unique academic abilities and providing an educational program that truly addresses those abilities in a caring and compassionate manner. The academic program at Archbishop Rummel High School offers three levels of college preparatory curriculum and is a carefully designed and coordinated program to fit the needs of each individual student. For example, a student may be strong in mathematics but not as strong in English. That student could be placed in an honors mathematics course, but placed in an academic English course. Students are placed into curriculums by the Academic Assistant Principal and the Department of Guidance after closely examining each student's entrance exam, standardized test scores, and previous academic scores.



## HONORS PROGRAM

Academically advanced students are encouraged to seek admittance into the school's Honors Program. These same academically gifted students may choose to enroll in a wide range of Advanced Placement (AP) courses in order to fully develop their academic potential as well as possibly earn college credit.

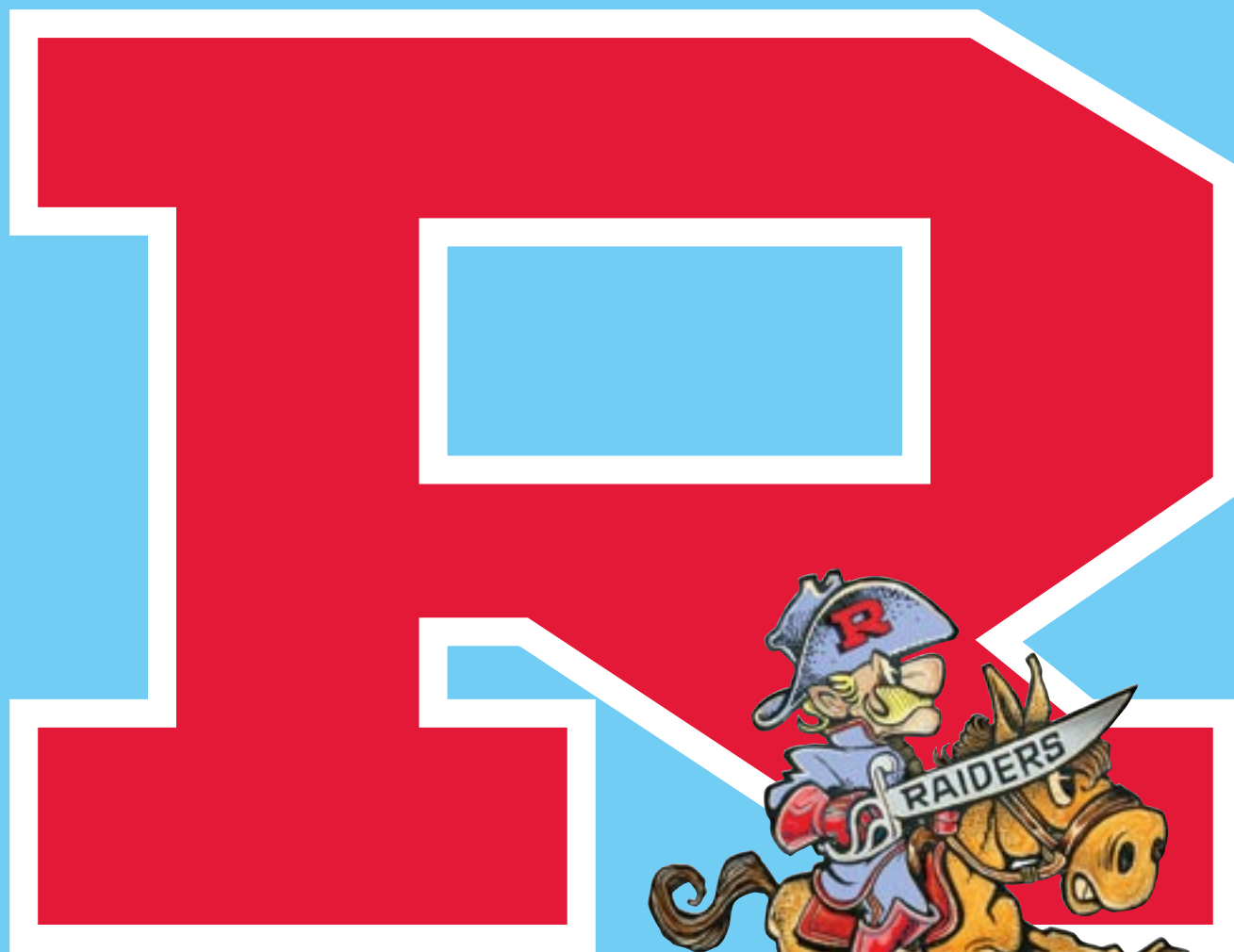
## PERSONAL TOURS
